- As of March 23rd, there are 133 cases (presumed/confirmed positive) in Boston
 - 15 people recovered in Boston; 2 deaths
 - 777 total cases in Massachusetts; 9 deaths
- On March 15th, the Boston Public Health Commission (BPHC) declared a public health emergency
 - Increased availability of public health staff and resources
 - Enhanced reporting, information, and resource sharing among Boston's health and medical community
- As of March 18th, Boston's Office of Emergency Management is activated at Level 1 – Full Activation

COVID-19 & Vulnerable Populations

- People experiencing homelessness and SUD may be at higher risk of contracting COVID-19
 - Difficult to follow recommendations like handwashing and stay-at-home
- May also be at higher risk of serious cases of COVID-19
 - Many our clients have hepatitis, heart disease, diabetes, and chronic lung disease, and other medical conditions that increase risk

- Boston opened two medical tents led by Boston Healthcare for the Homeless
 - Allows for quarantine and isolation of people experiencing homelessness

Program Modifications (Medical Tents)







- Moved programs, including AHOPE harm reduction program and Engagement Center, outdoors
- Implementing screening at residential programs (Mattapan) and shelters



- Working with City and State partners to identify new facilities for medical care, quarantine, and isolation
 - This includes retired medical facilities that can be retrofitted
 - Working with universities, hotels, and others to identify space for quarantine and isolation

 - Potential partnership to launch text-based chat rooms


